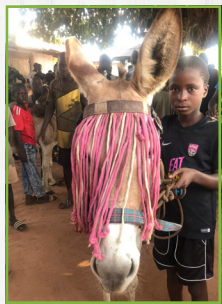
SWEET ITCH

WEATHER CHANGES

What rug to put on your horse can be a daily debate on a yard. It's especially tricky with changeable temperatures and conditions. Rugging is very different for every horse as it depends on age, breed, weight, climate, his work load, forage and even their coats themselves. Horses that are used to the colder weather and have spent most of their time outside, tend to cope better with cooler temperatures than horses that are stabled all the time. It also depends on the actual weather. - is it just cold or is it cold and raining or even snowing?-

Horses are extremely good at regulating their body temperature and are perfectly happy when the environmental temperature is between 5°C and 25°C (this is called their thermoneutral zone, where they can warm themselves up and cool themselves down using little additional energy).
